

## CHOOSING YOUR COURSE

#### At Cronton you can study:

#### A Level Programme

You will study three subjects over two years, primarily assessed through exams. Some subjects also include coursework and or practical assessments. A Levels provide a broad education across multiple subjects.

#### BTEC and UAL courses

These courses last for one or two years depending on the level and focus on a single subject, primarily assessed through coursework and exams (a Level 3 Extended qualification is studied over 2 years and equates to three A Levels).

#### T Levels

A T Level qualification combines classroom learning with real-world experience, with students spending 80% of their time in college and 20% on a structured industry placement. It is equivalent to three A Levels.



# TOMORROW'S SCIENTISTS


Students will be required to study A Levels in at least one science subject and should have a keen interest in science and enjoy working alongside other students and staff to hypothesise, research and investigate a particular aspect that intrigues or fascinates them.

## **Activities include:**

- Tutoring and preparation for the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)
- Prestigious work experience placements
- Take part in prestigious national programmes such as the Nuffield Research Placements
- Accreditation of the Silver Crest Awards for undertaking a scientific research project
- Guest lectures and master classes from leading science-based professionals
- Taking part in a Presentation Evening showcase to present research findings to an audience







# TOMORROW'S MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS

This enrichment is aimed at students who want to work within the health industries in the future as it provides the additional practical experiences required to study in this industry.

Students can participate in this programme independently or in conjunction with the Tomorrow's Scientists Programme. This initiative is tailored to provide students pursuing academic A Level subjects with essential practical experience, enhancing their applications for university programmes in the care and medical industries.

## TOMORROW'S LAWYERS

Students are not required to be studying any particular A Levels, but a keen interest in a legal career is essential. Students must enjoy reading, writing, performing, and debating. A willingness to work as part of a team is important.

#### **Activities include:**

- Mooting This is the oral presentation of a legal issue or problem against an opposing counsel and before a judge. It is perhaps the closest experience that a student can have whilst at college to appearing in court. Students will practice this, and take part in an internal Bar Mock Trial
- Participate in legal debates
- Targeted preparation for the Law National Aptitude Test (LNAT)
- Receive assistance in securing work experience with local law firms
- Receive information regarding insight events such as those with Atlantic Chambers
- Meet legal professionals including Lay Magistrates
- Have the opportunity to visit court

Students will need to be studying at least two national curriculum subjects at A Level.

#### Activities include:

- Develop presentation and classroom management skills alongside knowledge of the latest technological skills from outstanding teachers, weekly sessions include:

- Understand and learn about the world of education including Ofsted, policy standards and processes
- Understanding the student support processes
